The minutes of the January 2019 meeting were agreed

Aneurysm Screening: Phil

- Phil is from a project especially for Aneurysm Screening, he is based at the Royal Stoke Hospital, which cover the central and south areas of Cheshire East
- He gave a presentation about [aneurysm and the programme to screen](#)
- Aneurysm is a bulge in a blood vessel caused by a weakness in the blood vessel wall, it can be treated very well – so it is important that people are screened
- Phil explained that it is more common for men over 55 to suffer, but women of the same age can also suffer
- A number of people in the meeting asked why it is more common in men – Phil explained that national study showed it was more common but it is also looking at results for women
- The meeting also talked about the screening take-up by men from the learning disability population, Phil said this was national 80% - but this means 20% do not take up a screening

Making it real: Kate

- Kate presented information about [Making it Real](#) - a framework to support good personalised care and support for providers, those who commissions service and people who access them
- Kate is a coordinator of a local working group
- There are six themes, which you can read about in [the presentation Kate provided](#)
- Cheshire East Council have signed up to the themes
- People discussed the themes and how people think it is important to have a person centred approach to services
- Councillor Clowes welcomed Kate's contribution, and stressed how important this was to be considered as part of the co-production approach to commissioning new services by Cheshire East Council



- Mark Hughes confirmed this by saying such a person centred approach was used in the development of the new Respite Service, and was proving a success
- A parent / carer suggested a lot of people do not know what they are entitled to, just accepting services – this was discussed by everyone and agreed that this should not be happening
- People in the meeting suggested that all contract's need to be person centred, what was important to that person receiving the service. This was agreed and forms part of the way in which services are commissioned in Cheshire East

Pure Innovation: Louise and Peter

- Louise and Peter provide us with a [presentation about their company's services](#)
- They said that the company mainly works around Great Manchester, but does operate a [community café in Handforth](#)
- They recently joined Cheshire East Adults Services Dynamic Purchasing System, the framework in which procurement of care and support services for individuals eligible for Adult and Children's social care support, including those individuals in transition to adulthood who have a learning disability
- Louise and Peter stated they look forward to working within the framework in the future



Community JSNA: Learning Disability: Suzanne

- Suzanne provided information about her work for the Community JSNA for Learning Disability
- She works with a number of different organisations, including Public Health in collecting information
- Suzanne is working on a project that is pulling together all services and listing them – or ‘asset mapping’ what services are available
- This means Suzanne is meeting many different groups and individuals, including our group. She aims to complete the work in the summer
- The meeting welcomed this project, and stressed that she needs to link with [Cheshire East Living Well](#)
- The meeting asked whether Suzanne can return and provide an update at a future meeting

- Jackie raised a concern about the process for [Direct Payment](#) auditing and payment, she had recently experienced the process and became concerned. She added this has also been raised at the North Subgroup
